- Flower Spikes: *Carex albicans* vs *Carex eburnea*
- Plants: *Borodinia dentata* vs *Borodinia laevigata*
- Leaf Shape: *Delphinium tricorne* vs *Cardamine concatenata*
- Distinguishing: *Dicentra canadensis* vs *Dicentra cucullaria*
- Finding 6 Violets: *Viola palmata* vs *Viola pubescens* vs *Viola sororia* vs *Viola striata* vs *Hybanthus concolor* vs *Viola pedata* (both hen and rooster variations at Petroglyphs)
- Mottled Leaves: *Erythronium albidum* vs *Trillium recurvatum* vs *Hydrophyllum* vs *Hepatica acutiloba*
- Finely-Cut Leaves: *Dicentra canadensis* vs *Dicentra cucullaria* vs *Corydalis flava*
- Distinguishing: *Enemion biternatum* vs *Thalictrum thalictroides*
- Finding 4 Bedstraws: *Galium aparine* vs *Galium concinnum* vs *Galium circaezans* vs *Galium triflorum*
- Comparing Trifoliates: *Hepatica* (actually lobes) vs *Arisaema triphyllum* (actually leaflets) vs *Trillium* (actually modified stems)
- Buttercups: *Ranunculus micranthus* vs *Ranunculus abortivus* vs *Ranunculus harveyi*
- Deeply-Cut Leaves: *Polymnia canadensis* vs *Rudbeckia laciniata* vs *Hydrophyllum* vs *Stylophorum diphyllum*
- 4-Leaf Whorl: *Galium circaezans* vs *Silene stellata*
- Fernlike: *Osmorhiza* vs *Cystopteris* vs *Chaerophyllum*
- Arrow-Shaped: *Nabalus altissimus* vs *Nabalus crepidineus*
