NOTES

WHERE WE WALKED: We met at the Visitor's Center parking lot and caravanned to the large Woodbine Trail parking lot, where we began our walk at its southeast corner.

SHORT OBSERVATIONS:

- As was our goal, we found the elusive Three-Birds Orchid (*Triphora trianthophoros*). As usual, Kathy Bildner was the first to find it. But soon afterwards Gisela found another one, and before long almost everybody had found their own! John joked that he was tired of looking at all the weedy things.
- It was heartwarming to find a Father Sullivan's Ash Tree. Our friend had passed away earlier this summer. Our group would not even exist were it not for his dedication over the years. Coincidentally, he was with us last October when we walked this trail. Afterwards he drove his car over a raised curb (who hasn't done that?) but it caused such damage to his Prius that it had to be towed away. Oh, the countless memories he has given us!
- We have 3 *Hylodesmum* species in the St. Louis area, and we found all three! If this were a card game, we would have won for sure. Alex was the first to find one – the uncommon *Hylodesmum pauciflorum* (Fewflower Ticktrefoil). John found the remaining two (*Hylodesmum glutinosum* and *Hylodesmum nudiflorum*).
